SYNOPSIS

Julia, a Cuban-American, visits Cuba for the first time to collect the ashes of her recently-deceased grandmother. While there, she meets three Cuban contemporaries, Olivia, Carlos and Miguel, and comes face-to-face with the life she could have lived had her father not been sent as a boy to Miami during "Operation Peter Pan." While sheltering in place during an unprovoked military attack on Havana, "Operation Coyote," the four are forced to confront their own prejudices and misconceptions about each other and each other's countries. Reflecting the zeitgeist of present-day Cuba, *Havana Coyotes* explores the disparate ways we can all be "coyotes" in our relationships with others.



BENJAMIN ORIFICI


Writer/Director/Producer

viewers' expectations by crafting unique visual and emotional landscapes to better understand current social issues.


He holds an M.F.A. in film directing from the Feirstein Graduate School of Cinema in New York City and is a member of the Board of Advisors for the renowned Anthology Film Archives in Manhattan. Through the years, he has maintained strong connections to Cuba as an Advisory Board member of the NYC cultural foundation, American Friends of the Ludwig Foundation of Cuba (AFLFC). He is co-founder of the film production company, Celluloid Rain Productions, based in New York and Paris. Benjamin relocated to the Miami region with his family during the pandemic and teaches film production at Lynn University.

"Throughout my career, I've adhered to the concept of what I call 'Film Terroir,' meaning my films are intimate, personal and exhibit the characteristic flavor and tone of the region in which they're filmed. Through it all, my goal remains constant: I strive to challenge viewers' expectations by crafting unique visual and emotional landscapes to better understand a region in particular, and, the world at large."


LUIS ABEL OLIVEROS

Writer/Casting Director

Luis Abel Oliveros is a Cuban writer and director. He is a graduate of the Universidad de las Artes (ISA), Cuba, with a degree in audiovisual communications.

For the past 14 years he has worked as a screenwriter and director at the Cuban public television station, Habana Canal, IRCT. Luis is also a teacher and coordinator of TV and New Media at the Escuela Internacional de Cine y TV, San Antonio de los Baños, Cuba.

Luis has directed and, in several cases, written documentaries including *CorAlina, The Fourth Villa, María* and *Degree of Protection II*.





DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

I believe that *Havana Coyotes* captures the zeitgeist of today's Cuba—the trials and tribulations of present-day Habaneros trying to make their way in a perpetually-sanctioned, post-pandemic, terrorist-labelled economy. This is a love story that exposes the current social and political truths while, at the same time, reveals the pride and love of country.






In private screenings in Havana, I heard the same refrain: "We've never seen this in any films; this is what's going on right now in Cuba." My Cuban co-writer and I worked for over a year on this script; through many false starts, we finally hit upon a vital story that could be executed clandestinely with the resources available. No actor was ever filmed on state-owned property. (cont. →)


DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT (continued)



I started visiting Cuba in 2015 as a member of a New York cultural foundation. And I am still in awe of this place, so full of passion, music, rhythm—amid such economic calamity. When I look back, the seeds of *Havana Coyotes* took root during that first trip. Ten years later, it has finally emerged—fully grown—and ready to spread its seeds to viewers who have but a glancing stereotype of this rich and wondrous country.

To enter Cuba incognito in May 2024, we brought all our equipment into the country in suitcases. Several of us were detained for hours. We encountered storms, daily electricity blackouts, and intense heat. The all-Cuban cast and Cuban support staff worked so hard to make this film a reality—even in the face of intrinsic danger to their own liberty.

Wendell Laurent is an actor, writer and producer based in New York. He wrote, co-produced and starred in the multi-award-winning short film **Daybreak** and made his feature film debut as







BARNEY OLDFIELD Producer





MAYRA MAZORRA PÉREZ as Pucha

Mayra Mazorra Pérez is a prolific theater, film, and television actress. A graduate of the National School of Arts and the Higher Institute of Arts, she has worked with the most prestigious theater companies in Cuba. She has also appeared on television in soap operas and series, as well as in national and international films such as *El Beny, Ciudad en Rojo, Paraíso, La Isla de la Guayaba* and *Taxiboll*. She has received acting awards in both theater and television.

JUANNALISE RICARDO as Olivia

Juannalise Ricardo is a Cuban actress with a long career in the world of theater and audiovisual arts. She graduated with honors from the School of Dramatic Arts in Santiago de Cuba. She has been an actress at the International Film School of San Antonio de los Baños (EICTV) for seven years, where she has also trained in the Sanford Meisner technique in acting. She is the lead actress in the theater company, "La Montaña." She has also worked with other companies such as "Gaviota" and "Hubert de Blanc." *Mancha, La Pecera, Cuentos de un día y mas* and *El Camino* are some of the short films and movies she has worked on.



ANNABEL NOVO as Julia

Annabel Novo graduated from de Cuban National School of Arts (ENA) in 2019 as an actress and from the Higher Institute of Arts (ISA) in 2023 as a director of photography. She has a short but rich experience as an actress in cinema, theatre and television. Some of her most memorable characters are: Nara (from the eponymous movie directed by Rosa Maria Rodriguez Pupo), Maria (from the TV Show *Calendar* directed by Magda González Grau), Beba (from the Cuban play *The Night of the Murderers* directed by Arianna Delgado) and Don Liborio (from the Cuban play *The Golden Cow* directed by Rei Castaneda).



GEORBIS MARTINEZ as Miguel






